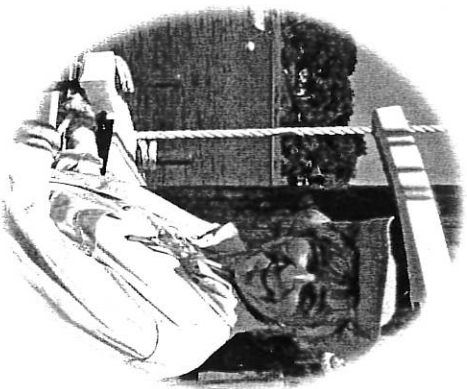


Fun on the Water:

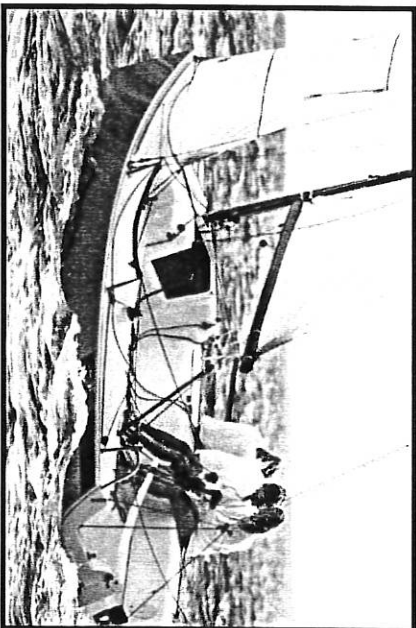


When & Where does the SHIP Meet?

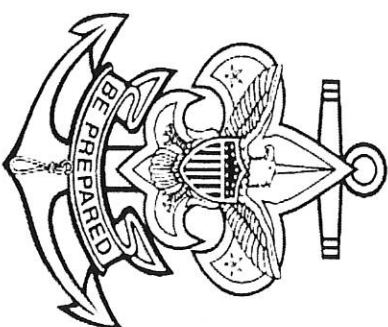

Who Are the Sea Scouts?

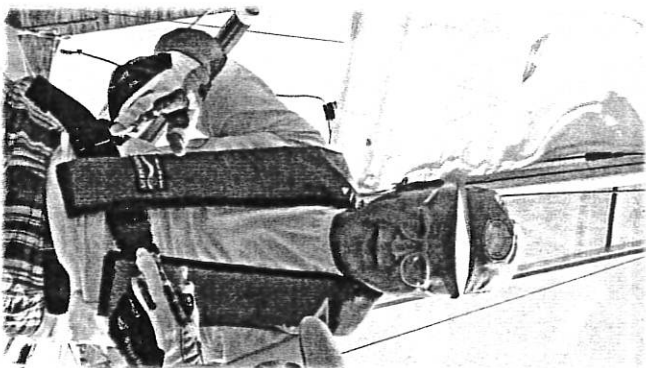

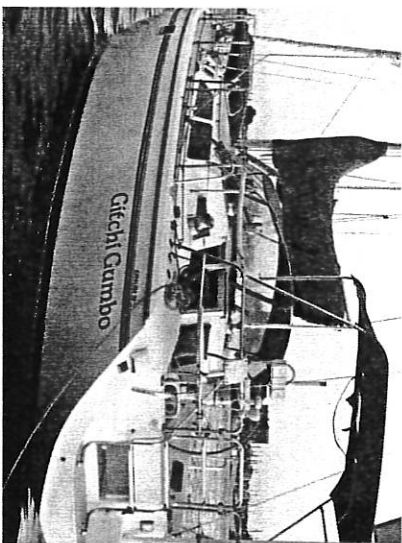


What does a Ship's meeting consist of?
