Just what is it you need? New members! And where can you get them? Well, one way is to attract them at Webelos Woods, October 18, 19, and 20th at the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception in Huntington. The district is once again conducting this event and we need Troops and Crews to run activity stations. This is an opportunity for your unit to strut its stuff for potential new members and their parents. The Webelos advancement stations will include Readyman/First Aid, Fire Building, Map and Compass, Cooking, and Knot Tying. We will also be looking for additional stations to provide program or knowledge activities for the Webelos including: Whittling Chip, Archery and Handicap Awareness. Based on feedback from prior Webelos Woods, **all stations should be a brief demonstration, then a “hands on” activity by the Webelos. With heavy emphasis on hands on.** For advancement stations, please use the Webelos Handbook as the goal is to help the Webelos earn their Arrow of Light Award.

Back by popular demand: as an added bonus, we would like each unit to create a pioneering project near your campsite as a static display. If your Troop or Crew wishes to participate and has something special to demonstrate, join us for the day. If you have flyers, pamphlets or other advertising, feel free to hand it out that day. We also have a new promotion for our scouts to invite a Non-Scouter friend to attend. You can print up the **Free Day Pass**. Parents must attend with the non-scouter and it is from 9am-4pm. All non-scouters are not allowed to sleep over.

Arrow of Light and moving up ceremonies in Cub Scouts Packs are scheduled to start in January and run through April/May, and beforehand Webelos will be visiting Troops they might like to join with their parents.

Please turn in a registration form with the number of people participating. The event will cost \$16 per person. Remember to register early so you can claim your camp site marked on the Webelos Woods map because the camp site reservation is first come, first serve basis.

A Webelos/parent fun camping weekend

How It Works

Cub Scout Webelos, their parents, and leaders bring their own gear and camp out from Friday night to Sunday morning. They supply all their own camping equipment and food for the weekend. They participate in the activities on Saturday, the campfire on Saturday night, and Sunday morning closing.

Boy Scout troops camp out Friday night to Sunday morning bringing with them all their camping gear and food for the weekend. They select “activity stations”, which are coordinated by the Matinecock District activities committee, and provide the Saturday program for the Webelos.

Everyone attending – Webelos, parents, Boy Scouts, leaders, staff – pay the \$16.00 fee. This fee pays for: a patch for every paid attendee, ribbons for each unit, the cost of the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception, sanitation costs, registration costs, other recognition costs, and program reimbursements.

WEBELOS WOODS RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Parking personal vehicles will only be allowed in designated areas at the main Seminary building. Only authorized vehicles will be allowed beyond that point. No personal vehicle can park past the tennis courts Units will be allowed to bring a trailer that will be transported to the designated campsite. Trailers will be permitted on the camping area on a few conditions. If the trailer is a single axel, then it must be properly leveled and secured in the back of the camp site. Double Axel trailers should be fine. Please pack light as you will need to hike in all personal gear for the weekend. The District will have designated vehicles to assist with the transport of unit equipment and individuals not able to make the walk to the event area.
2. Upon arrival, **ALL UNITS** MUST check-in at the Registration Tent. This applies to both troops and packs. The unit leader in charge must check in. **AN ELECTRONIC ROSTER MUST BE PROVIDED VIA EMAIL PRIOR TO OCTOBER 18, 2019 OR ON A THUMB DRIVE OR A CD-ROM.** Please provide the following information in your roster (Excel Format Preferred) unit number, first & last name of each individual (youth & adult) attending, youth or adult designation, registered position for any adults and the school grade of each Webelos Scout. **ANY FEES OWED MUST BE PAID AT THIS TIME.** You will be directed to your campsite at this time. Campsite size is based on the number of participants that you pre-registered for.
3. **UNIT LEADERS SHOULD HAVE MEDICAL INFORMATION FOR ALL YOUTH AND ADULTS WITH THEM, AT ALL TIMES.**
4. Your campsite will be inspected before you arrive, during the weekend, and at the end of the weekend. Patches will be distributed by the STAFF member inspecting your campsite at the end of the weekend.
5. Quiet hours are from 11 pm to 6:30 am. Please be courteous of other Scouts in the area. **QUIET HOURS WILL BE ENFORCED!** If you're using a CPAP machine and/or other necessary equipment that can cause a disturbance for neighbors after hours, please notify REGISTRAION and we'll make arrangements to create a space for you to minimize the disturbance.
6. Fires are only permitted in elevated metal containers only. **Fires are not to be left unattended at any time.** Please insure that there is adequate water near the fire at all times. At the end of the event, all ashes must be put out entirely and placed in the supplied dumpsters. **MAKE SURE THE ASH IS OUT BEFORE PLACING IN BAG OR IN THE DUMPSTER.**
7. **ALL INCIDENTS OF INJURY, LOST PERSON(S) AND OTHER SAFETY ISSUES MUST BE REPORTED IMMEDIATELY TO REGISTRAION. WE HAVE MEDICAL**

STAFF ON GROUNDS WHO WILL TREAT ALL MEDICAL INJURIES. The STAFF will assess other incidents and take appropriate action as needed.

8. An audible signal will be issued in the event of an event-wide emergency or a lost youth. All participants are to return to their campsites and conduct a head count. Two runners are to report to registration and advise the staff as to the status of the unit's participants. All participants are to remain at their campsite and await further instructions or until the all clear signal is issued.
9. All Webelos and Scouts are to be supervised by their parents or leaders at all times. The youth are your responsibility to control. **THE BUDDY SYSTEM WILL BE ENFORCED.**
10. The BSA prohibits the use of alcoholic beverages and controlled substances at any activity involving the participation of youth members. **ANYONE** found with alcohol or controlled substances will be directed to leave the event immediately. Unit leaders are responsible for ensuring compliance with this requirement.
11. BSA policy prohibits smoking in front of youth. This includes all forms of tobacco or other smoking products.
12. Please instruct your youth to keep the portable toilets as clean as possible.
13. **DO NOT deface, remove, destroy or injure any tree, flower, shrub, fern, moss or other plant, rock, fossil or mineral found or growing on the parklands. Birds and their nests and other wildlife must not be molested or disturbed. Practice "Leave No Trace" camping.**
14. Please read your "Guide to Safe Scouting".
15. **PLEASE - ONLY WEBELOS and SCOUTS, BSA ARE ABLE TO CAMPOUT / SLEEP OVER.**
