Safety Moments

For the safety of our Scouts, NO vehicles will be allowed beyond the gates of the parking lots

Emergency contacts

- In a serious emergency (seizure, heart attack, hypothermia, serious bleeding, trauma) call 911 immediately then contact Kurt or Tali.
- For general first aid, come to the dining hall or contact Tali or Kurt

Signs and symptoms of hypothermia include:

- Shivering.
- Slurred speech or mumbling.
- Slow, shallow breathing.
- Weak pulse.
- Clumsiness or lack of coordination.
- Drowsiness or very low energy.
- Confusion or memory loss.

NOTE: For EMERGENCY warming during the overnight:

- All troops in cabins should **NEEDS TO ALLOW** any scouts and leaders needing EMERGENCY warming
- Also, most restrooms are heated

Dining Hall is available at ALL times for EMERGENCY warming

Lost person procedures:

If a person has been identified as missing, find the nearest adult leader with a walkie talkie. Each station should have an adult equipped with one. Contact Kurt or Tali. If you hear 3 loud horn blasts, that indicates we have a missing person. Drop everything you are doing and meet at the Dining Hall for search party instructions.

Suspicious person on premise:

If a suspicious person is on campus that no one knows nor recognizes, contact Tali, Kurt, and/or adult with a walkie talkie to indicate the whereabouts of the individual. If concerned, all scouts and leaders should go to cabins or camp building and wait for instructions.

Go/No Go for an event:

The camp/venue will be contacted the day before and day of to ask about the condition of the site. The decision will come from the committee of the event ASAP. When filling out the registration form, it is imperative you fill in a reliable contact number of an individual who will be at the event. The number in the registration form will place in a text group to notify unit's of weather conditions, emergency information, committee's decision to open or close event, etc.
